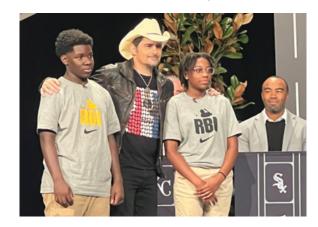

Mission Statement:

Kids and Coaches, a 501c(3) charity, advocates year round for Nashville's underserved 5-12 year old inner-city children using local city parks and community centers so they can be included in youth sports leagues, which are effective in raising children out of the poverty cycle and increasing grades, educational success, health, and reducing criminal involvement and incarceration.

Because this population has neither the funds or transportation to travel any distance we use the local community centers and public fields to conduct the sports leagues for the well being of the kids, community, and city.



WAVERLY BELMONT BULLDOGS (WBB)

Waverly Belmont Bulldogs (WBB) has been in existence for over 40 years, and they are an active Members of the Tennessee Youth Football League. "Their goals are to deliver the best possible character-building activity that not only makes great men and women, but also teaches teamwork, ethics, self-control, and community skills that everyone needs. Studies show the impact of youth sports carried through high school into adult life."



Suburban private sports can cost up to \$880 per child per season: Kids & Coaches only charges \$60 per child, or the parent pays what they can...

5 to 12 year old inner-city kids are not eligible for private school sports because of lack of transportation and funds

THE KING HOLLANDS AND GLORIA MCKISSACK **SCHOLARSHIP AWARD**

Kids & Coaches presented awards to those students who have attended our sports programs and are now attending university.

We have 26 recipients of these rewards. The Girls will be receiving the Gloria McKissack Award and the Boys will be receiving the King Hollands Award.

Both Gloria and King are the veterans of the sit-ins of the 1961 civil right movement in Nashville with John Lewis that broke open the Jim Crow barriers in the south. Those sit-ins allowed African Americans a seat at the table in a restaurant and led them to getting a seat at the university.
